School Council successes for the Year 2023 -2024

The School Council have been a fantastic school council and have been committed to achieving and organising many wonderful events within our school. Here are their successes they have achieved throughout this year.

<u>Mode Shift stars Bronze Award – School travel plan</u>

The School Council have maintained the Mode shift stars Bronze award status and we have been actively working on our school travel plan to achieve out travel plan targets. We will be continuing this next year into 2025.

We have completed travel surveys for every class in school and we used that information to inform our Walk to School Week in the summer term to encourage the children to walk to school and look after the environment. The School Council delivered Walk to School assemblies across school and encouraged children to walk to school by organising and delivering the walk to school passports in every class across school. This was a very successful event with a high number of children walking to school. This year most classes across KS1 and KS2 had every child walking part or all the way to school during that week.

## Democracy Week

Democracy is one of our British Values at Lowton West. This year, the children have taken part in class assemblies and activities as part of Democracy Week to help them gain a better understanding of what Democracy is and how having a voice is important. The School Council and Eco Committee help to give that voice within school and last week we invited the children from Years 2 to 6 to put themselves forward as a class representative for this school year. Children who would like to stand for election have presented speeches to their classes this week and we held an Election day in the hall to allow the voting process to happen.
