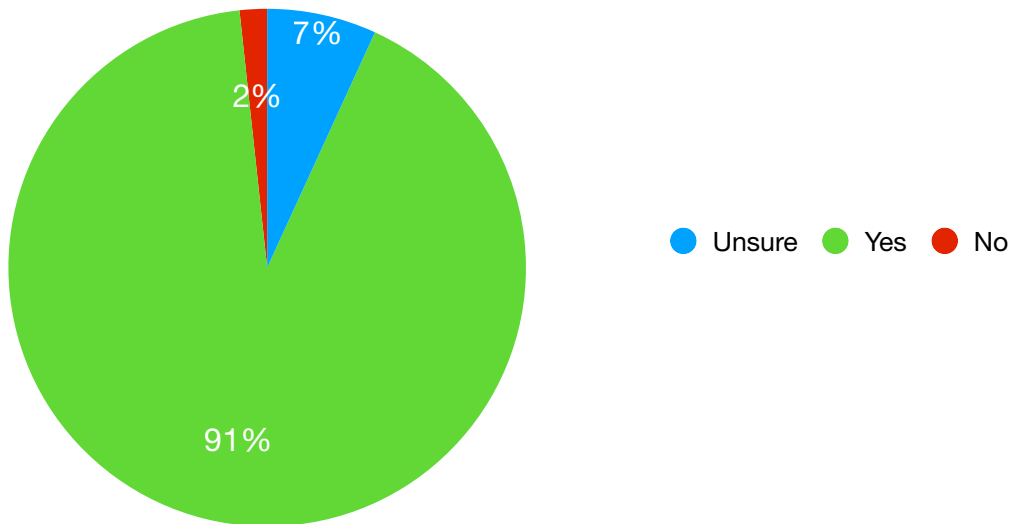

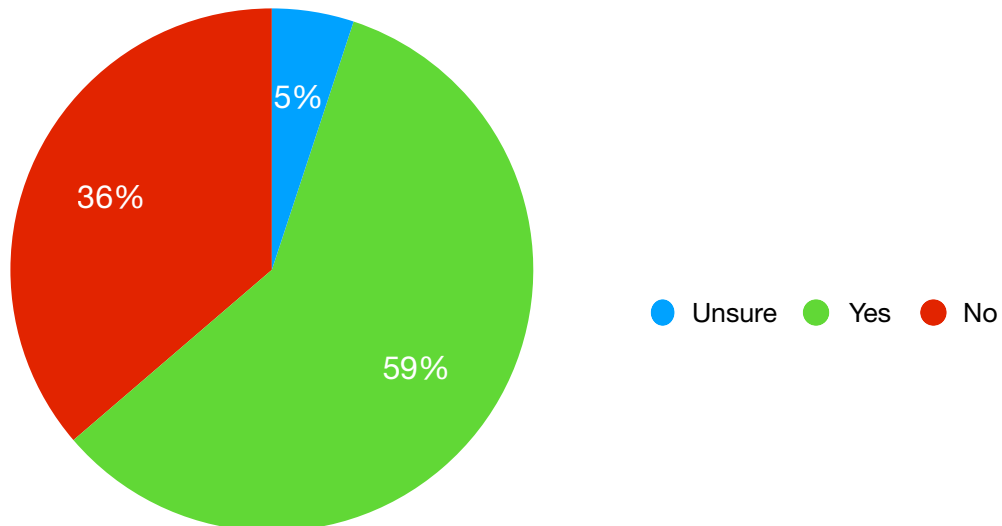
Q1) I understand what the new Relationships Education Curriculum will cover in primary school.



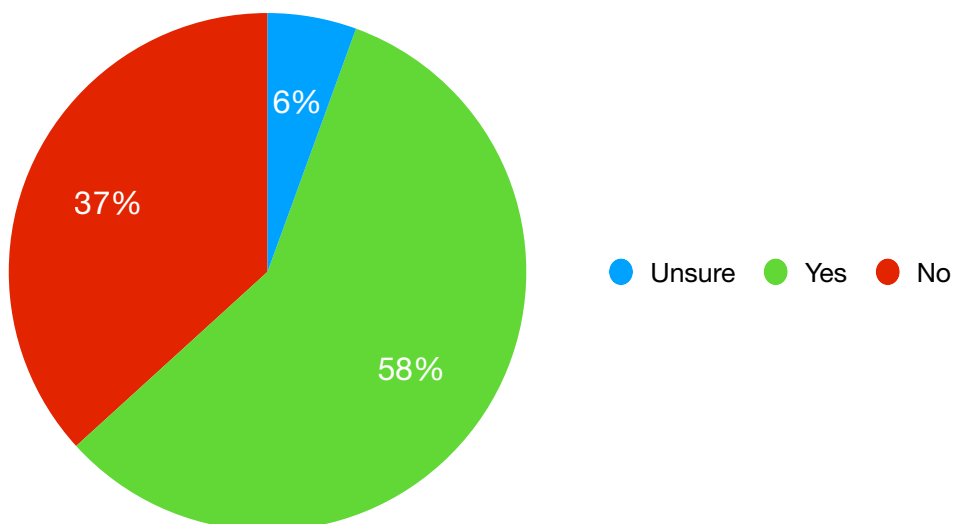
Q2) I understand what the new Health Education Curriculum will cover in primary school



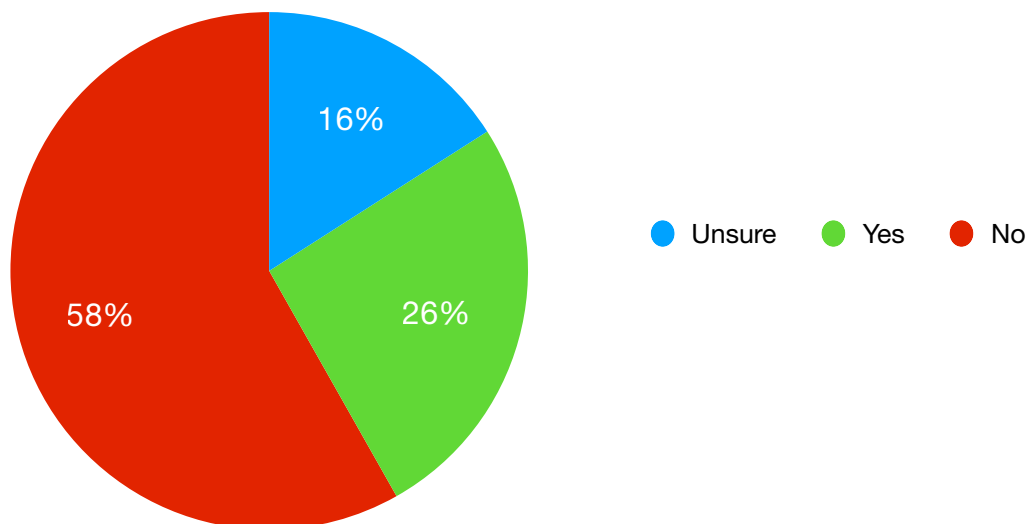
Q3) I would like to know more about what school will be teaching under the subject Relationships Education



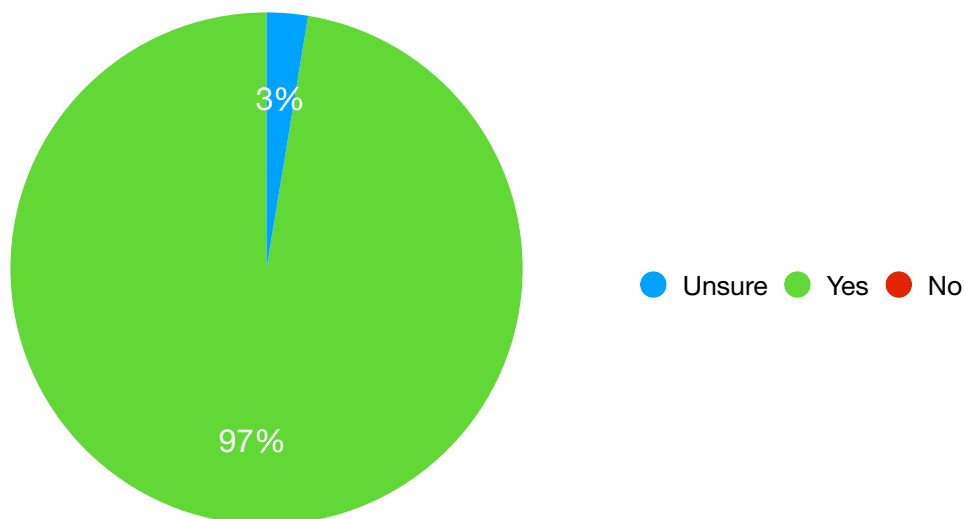
Q4) I would like to know more about what school will be teaching under the subject Health Education.



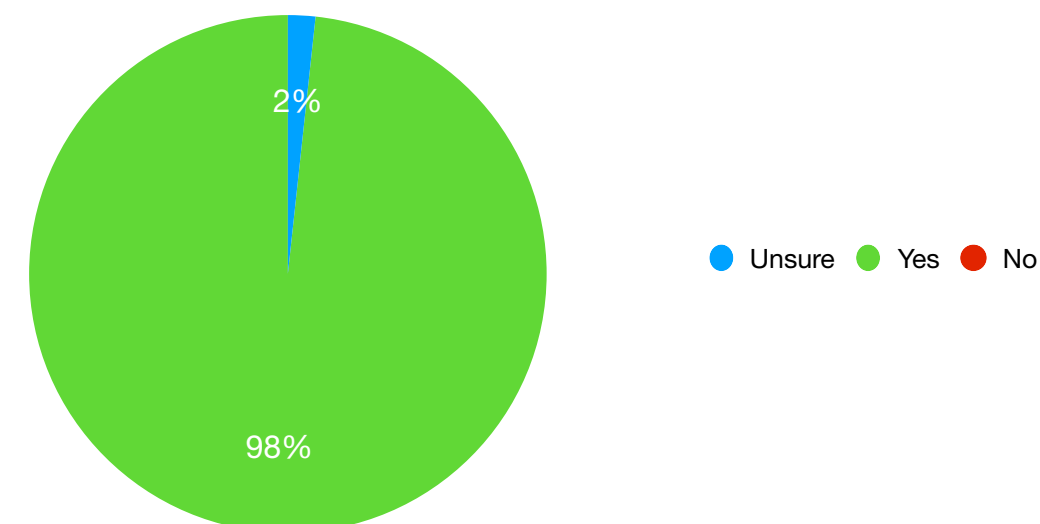
Q5) I would like to attend workshops about Relationships and Health Education.



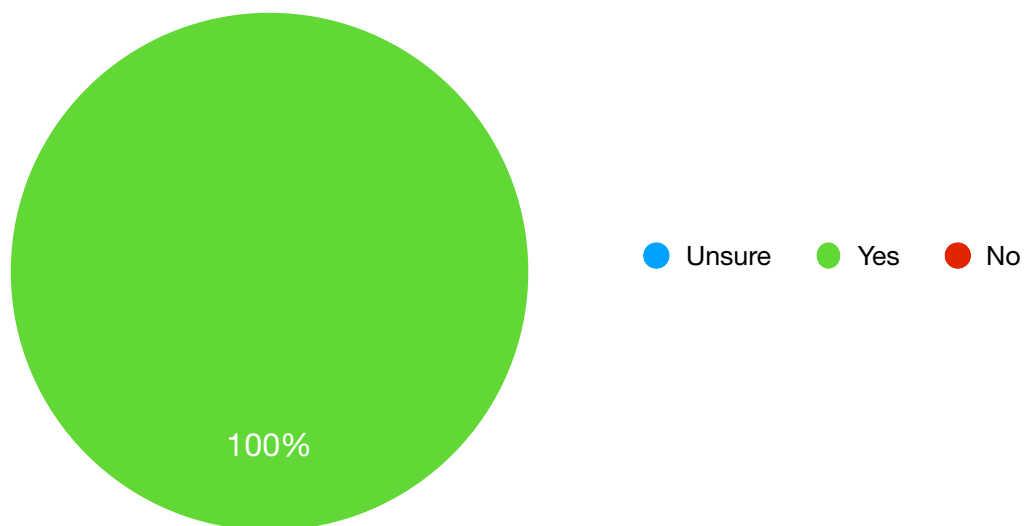

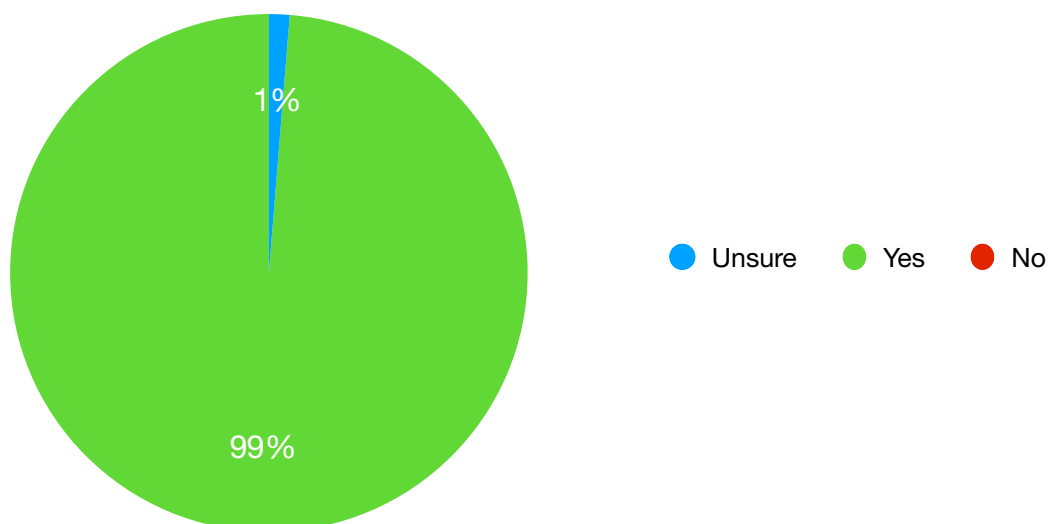

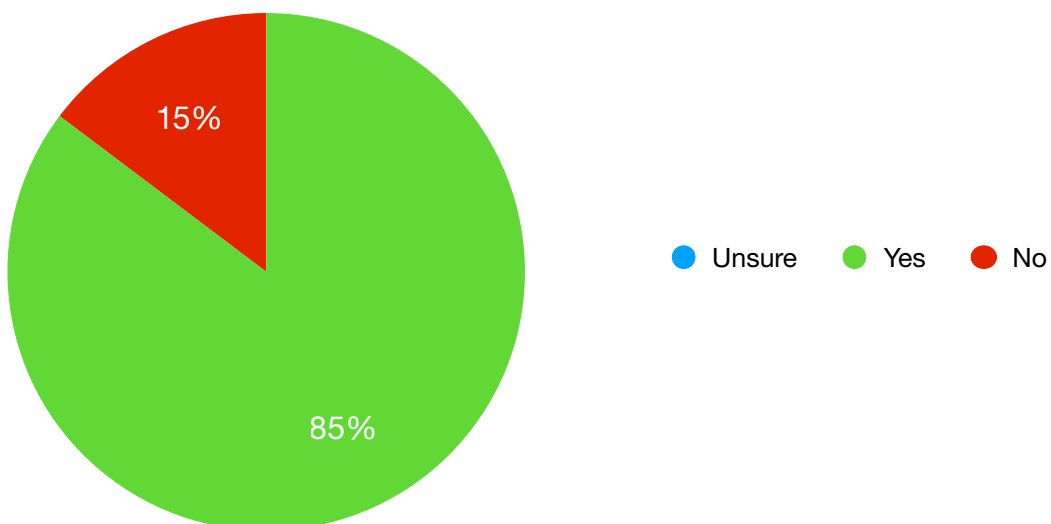
Q8) I appreciate the benefit of children being taught about relationships and acknowledge the link to safeguarding.



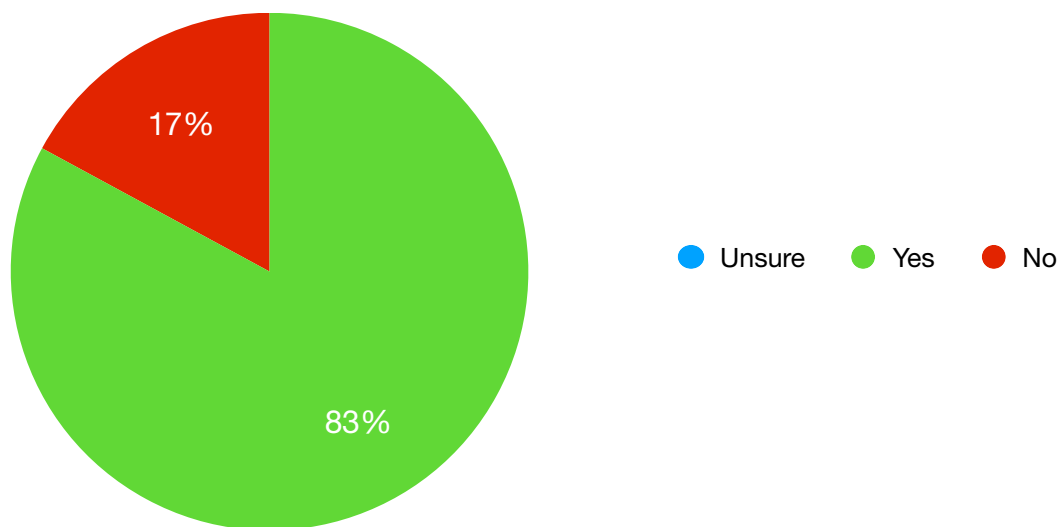
Q9) I feel confident about answering my child's questions linked to relationships and growing up.



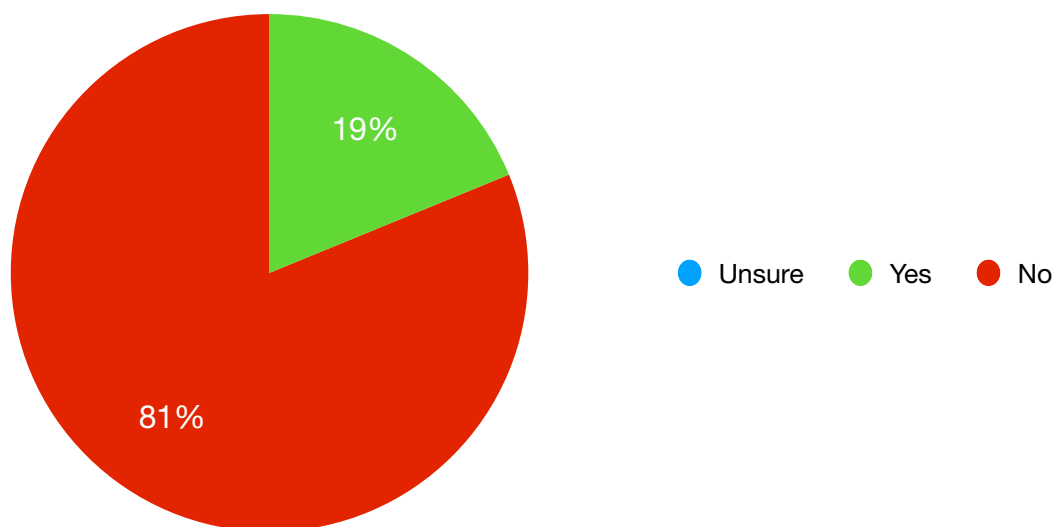

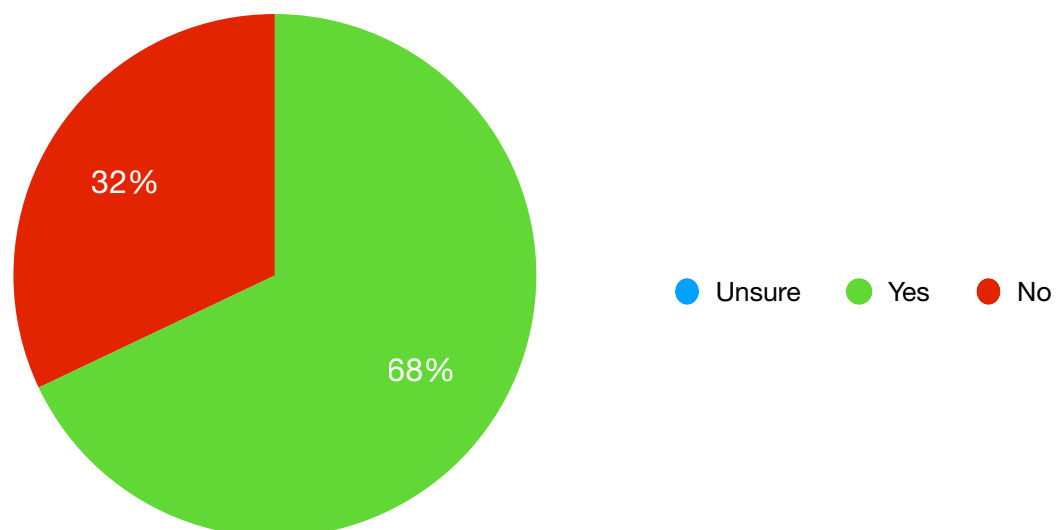
Q11) I would like to know when my child is going to be participating in Health Education.



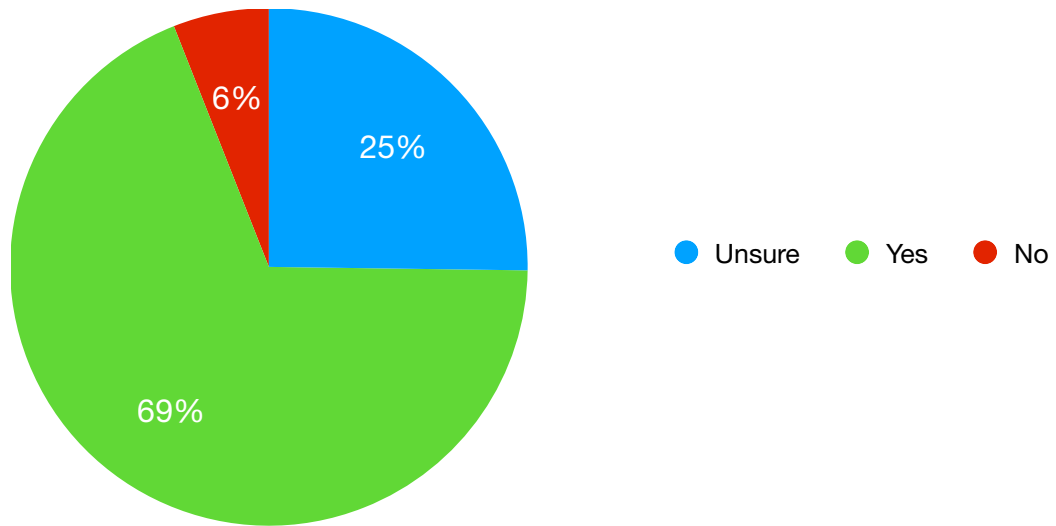

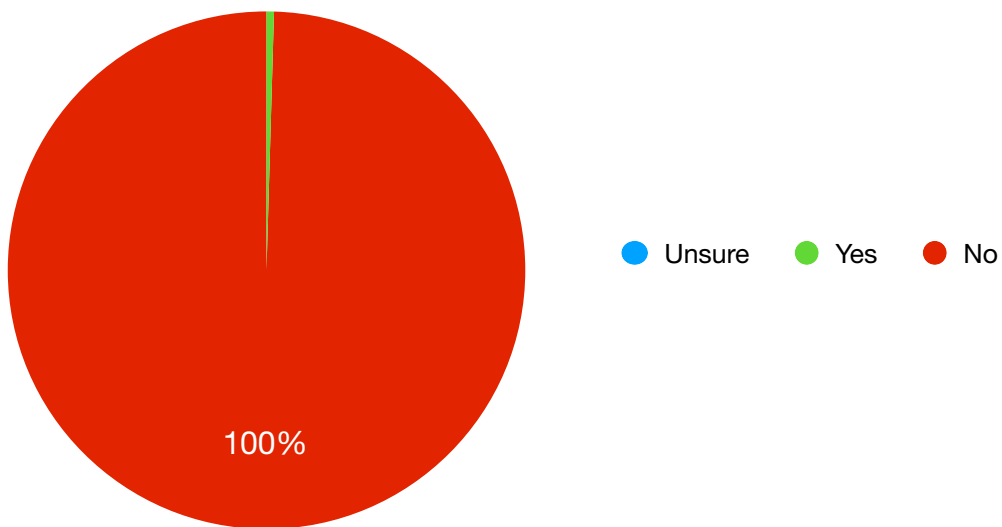

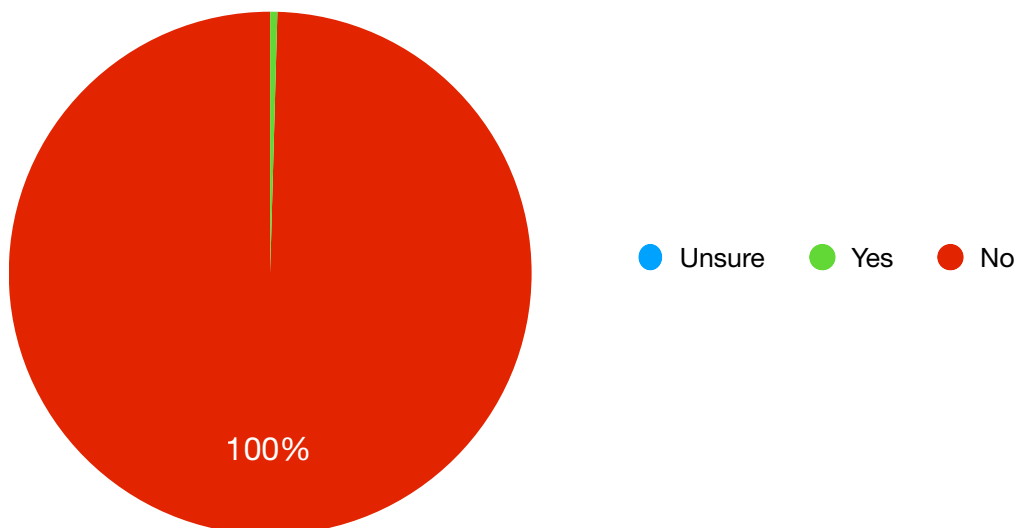

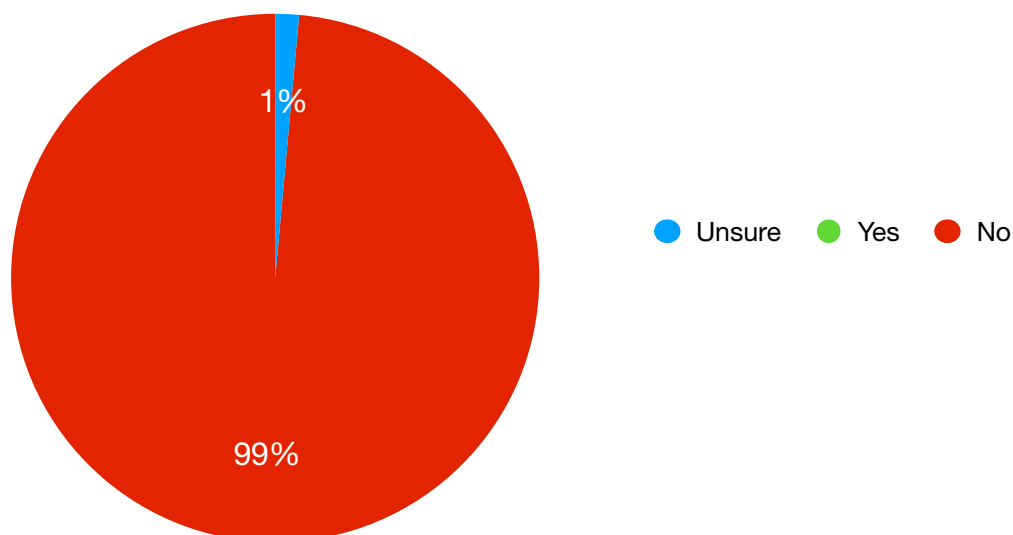

Response	Action
19% said they would like to be informed about the right to withdraw my child from Sex Education Lessons.	The right to withdraw from Year 6 Sex Education lessons will be covered in Lowton West's PSHE (including RSE/HE) policy and letter will be sent to parents/carers of children in Year 6 when these sessions are ready to be taught.

A list of books for each Year group and topic in the Jigsaw Scheme of work will be added the School website in the PSHE Section for parents/carers to view.

Q14. I would like school to include a conception and pregnancy lesson when the children reach Year 6?

Response	Action
69% would like school to include a conception and pregnancy lesson when the children reach Year 6.	<p>The DFE recommends that all primary schools should have a sex education programme that suits the age, emotional and physical maturity of the pupils to prepare them for their transition to high school, where they will have the opportunity to learn about this in more detail. At Lowton West, aim to ensure that all pupils are prepared for the changes that adolescence brings by delivering puberty lessons. A new session will be delivered in Year 6 that will provide information on how a baby is conceived and born as pupils of this age often have questions about this that we currently do not answer. Consequently, we would like to offer this session to pupils in Year 6 as we feel that this is crucial for equipping them with the information they need for their next step in their education.</p> <p><b><u>The additional conception and pregnancy lesson would not be statutory and therefore parents/carers would have the right to request that their child is withdrawn from this lesson if they wish.</u></b></p>
